






Population Age 3-4 Enrolled in School, Percent

Colorado's child care system has long been under-resourced. The pandemic exocerbated existing workforce and affordability challenges.




According to the National Association for the Education of Young Children, in mid-2021:

80% of Colorado child care centers surveyed reported a staffing shortage

were serving fewer children 40% were unable to open classrooms. 34% had longer weitlists. 26% had to reduce operating hours.

Percent of Linguistically Isolated Households















Colorado households with children where children were not eating enough because food was unaffordable, June 2020—March 2022










